## The Woodrow Wilson High School

This new high school represents another step forward by the community and your Board of Education in providing adequate educational facilities for the city. Over three years were spent in planning, designing, and constructing this building. Situated on a thirty-seven and one-half acre site, this school is planned to provide a complete educational program. The classrooms and special instructional areas are equipped to make them efficient and pleasant laboratories for the teachers to carry on their work. The present building provides for an enrollment of 1600 students. However it is planned so that rooms can be added to take care of 2400 students.




In planning this building considerable thought was given to make it a community center. All of the facilities are available to the community for adult education classes, group meetings, forums, and recreation.
